



[From the Roman Missal:]

When the people are gathered, the priest approaches the altar with the ministers while the entrance chant is sung. When he has arrived at the altar, after making a profound bow with the ministers, the priest venerates the altar with a kiss.... Then, with the ministers, he goes to the chair. When the entrance chant is concluded, the priest and the faithful, standing, sign themselves with the sign of the cross, while the Priest, facing the people, says:

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

#### Amen.

Then the Priest, extending his hands, greets the people, saying:

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

And with your spirit.

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

And with your spirit.

or:




The Priest invites the faithful to make the Penitential Act:

Brethren (brothers and sisters), let us acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries.



A CELEBRATION OF THE ELECT WITH THE ASSEMBLY [FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT]

Presider: (while seated, inviting the elect)

Will the elect please come forward.

[While all sing the following antiphon, the elect come forward with their godparents before the first step, facing the altar and presider. The presider and deacon meet them there]

### Presider: [to the assembly]

People of God, we are assembled here in the midst of celebrating Lent, for Jesus himself calls us to renewed conversion and repentance. We pray for these elect, and for ourselves as well, that all be given a spirit of repentance, a sense of sin, and arrive at the true freedom of the children of God.

[addresses the elect] My dear elect, pray also with us in silence. We encourage you in your journey of faith with our prayer and our solidarity with you. As a sign of your inner spirit of repentance, kneel as we pray.


[ the elect kneel, and their godparents stand behind them, all facing the altar and presider]

Deacon: Will the assembly please stand.

(The assembly is cued to stand) [First, there is a moment of silent prayer]

#### INTERCESSIONS

Presider: (musician: tone "F") \$\mathcal{F}\$ Let us pray for these elect whom God has chosen. May the grace of the sacraments conform them to Christ in his passion and resurrection and enable them to triumph over the bitter fate of \(\sigma\) death.



**Deacon**: [sung] ♬ That these elect may be given the faith to acknowledge Christ as the resurrection and the life, we (let us) pray to the Lord. **Lord**, **hear our prayer**.


- ♬ That they may be freed from sin and grow in holiness that leads to eternal life, we (let us) pray to the Lord. **Lord, hear our prayer.**
- ♬ That liberated by repentance from the shackles of sin they may become like Christ by baptism, dead to sin and alive forever in God's sight, we (let us) pray to the Lord. Lord, hear our prayer.
- ♬ That they may be filled with the hope of the life-giving Spirit and prepare themselves thoroughly for their birth to new life, we (let us) pray to the Lord. Lord, hear our prayer.
- ## That the Eucharistic food, which they are soon to receive, may make them one with Christ, the source of life and resurrection, we (let us) pray to the Lord. Lord, hear our prayer.
- ☐ That all of us may walk in newness of life and show to the world the power of the risen Christ, we (let us) pray to the Lord. Lord, hear our prayer.
- ♬ That all the world may find Christ and acknowledge in him the promises of eternal life, we (let us) pray to the Lord. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

[ the godparents place their right hand on the shoulder of the elect]

### Presider: [spoken, with hands joined]

Father, source of all life, in giving life to the living you seek out the image of your glory and in raising the dead you reveal your unbounded power. Rescue these elect from the tyranny of death, for they long for new life through baptism. Free them from the slavery of Satan, the source of sin and death, who seeks to corrupt the world you created and saw to be good. Place them under the reign of your beloved Son, that they may share in the power of his resurrection and give witness to your glory before all. We ask this through Christ our Lord. All: Amen

[ The presider first lays hands on each of the elect, while the assembly sings the antiphon: "God of the living..."]



[At the conclusion of the laying on of hands and after singing the antiphon, the assembly stretches forth their right arms in blessing. The presider continues;]

Fresider: (musician: tone "F") Lord Jesus Christ, you commanded Lazarus to step forth alive from his tomb and by your own resurrection freed all people from death. We pray for these your servants, who eagerly approach the waters of new birth and hunger for the banquet of life. Do not let the power of death hold them back, for, by their faith, they will share in the triumph of your resurrection, for you live and reign forever and ev-\end{align\*}. All: Amen.



[The elect are ushered to stand]

#### PRESENTATION OF THE LORD'S PRAYER

[ the godparents stand with the elect]

Presider: O elect, listen to the gospel reading in which our Lord teaches his followers how to pray.

**Deacon:** A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew

At that time Jesus said to his disciples:

"Say this when you pray: 'Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil."


[Present the elect with their copy of The Lord's Prayer]

#### DISMISSAL

Presider Dear elect, as you leave us, ponder on the meaning and importance of the Lord's prayer. It is the prayer of solidarity of the People of God and expresses trust in a loving Father who loves all and saves all. Be assured as well of our loving support and prayers for you. Go in peace, for we look forward to the day when you will share fully in the Lord's Table.

(The elect leave)

All sing antiphon "God of all living"

The Elect and party leave. Wait for them to leave, in meditative silence or instrumental music. Following the tradition of the early church, do **not** start the profession of faith until they have completely left the area and are out of earshot.
