Noelani Mahoe shared with me a copy of Johnny Noble's manuscript collection of Hawaiian Songs ⁹ where this text is from; he was an avid collector of Hawaiian songs throughout his lifetime (1892-1944). No authorship is indicated; I have found no music for this text. Meanwhile I offer this musical setting as a practical means of using this text laden with place-names. Nalulua is the coastal area right before Kakahai'a National Wildlife Refuge at Kawela. Maunahui is a summit near along the forestry road near the Pu'u Kauwa fork; before the planting of trees by the CCC in the 1930s it may have commanded a view of both the downslope and nearby Waikolu Valley. Maunahui is also the general name of the hilly upcountry just east of Kala'e (see *Meyer*).




