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
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**“Acclamations are shouts of joy which arise from the whole assembly as forceful and meaningful assents to God’s Word and action. They are important because they make some of the most significant moments of the Mass stand out. It is of their nature that they be rhythmically strong, melodically appealing and affirmative.”** *Music in Catholic Worship, 1983*

*Light of the Nations Mass*, (as all mass-settings should), places a strong emphasis on the pre-eminence of assembly acclamations. The “other” service music items should be used only in context of the church year, rubric, pastoral sensibility and local custom. The organization of these materials reflects the dynamic of the restored Roman Rite and directly challenges the music minister and the community to celebrate Eucharist in the truly traditional way the church has longed asked. Too many communities and their music ministries remain unexcited, unchallenged, and unempowered to *further become* a Eucharistic people because of a lack of a full understanding of the direct simplicity and structure of the Eucharist, its powerful and grace-filled symbolism and its musical dynamism. The models of Mass-settings of the recent past [i.e., the last 1200 years] are often mis-appropriately held up as “traditional” models, leading to a further misunderstanding of what the Church and its Eucharistic celebrations are really all about. We need to *read and study and reflect* regularly all we can on the primary liturgical documents and all that they imply. Our communities’ Sunday preparations ought to be based on known liturgical principles, not on rationalized preferences. And after we’ve been enlightened, we still need to remind ourselves that all our preparation and work is not an end unto itself, as if we strove to create a good “product”. The center of all good liturgical preparation is

celebrating Christ and Christ’s Mystical Body, the assembly. I sincerely hope that those music ministers who find this music attractive and useful also continue their mission in the restoration of the Liturgy.




A few suggestions, if I may:

The music for this collection is intended as a resource for the entire church liturgical year. As a good seasonal planner, you have probably already assigned certain Eucharistic acclamation sets to the various seasons. If you are using the Eucharistic acclamations of *Light of the Nations Mass* for the Advent/Christmas seasons, you may reserve the use of the descants for the Christmas season, and you’ll effect a rather interesting transformation of the music. However, all these acclamations are for year-round use, of course. The final doxologies are by definition important sung items, even when the Lord’s Prayer is recited. Don’t neglect the year-round practice of singing them.

The litanies, hymns of praise, gathering rites and other service music should be used on a seasonal basis as per church year and local custom. Only the Eucharistic acclamations require continuity of music style to help unify the Eucharistic Prayer. [see *Liturgical Music Today, No. 15* ]. Therefore, all the other acclamations and service music can and should be used independently of the Eucharistic acclamations.
